


THIS MAP SHOWS A PORTION OF THE GUILDERLAND WATER SYSTEM AND THE NON-SERVICED LANDS OF WESTERN GUILDERLAND. THE ALTAMONT WATER SYSTEM HAS NOT BEEN SHOWN ON THIS MAP.

AREAS SHADED YELLOW TO RED ARE ELEVATED HIGHER THAN CAN BE SERVICED FROM THE EXISTING WATER SYSTEM WITHOUT ADDITIONAL PUMPING AND STORAGE.

AREAS IN GREEN ARE POTENTIALLY SERVICEABLE FROM THE EXISTING SYSTEM CONSIDERING ELEVATION CRITERIA ALONE. PRODUCTION CAPABILITIES AND OTHER LIMITATIONS HAVE NOT YET BEEN DETERMINED AT THIS TIME.

AREAS IN PURPLE REPRESENT THE APPROXIMATE FRINGE ELEVATIONS THAT MAY HAVE POTENTIALLY LOW PRESSURES ON PEAK DEMAND CONDITIONS. THESE AREAS WILL NEED EXTENSIVE ENGINEERING STUDY.
